BOARD OF DIRECTORS UPDATE

The Board of Directors wishes to thank all of our property owners who voted yes on the referendum to fix our dam. The lake is a very valuable amenity to our community and without it we all would suffer. Whether you use the lake or not it does add value to your property. We now have a very long road to traverse as far as getting all of the designs, permits and construction bids in place and scheduling the repairs to the dam.

There were 1,760 ballots sent in. 1,413 were in favor and 347 were against the dam repair. The first Special assessment invoices have been mailed out. If paying in installments, the first payment of \$125.00 are due June of 08. The second payment of \$125.00 will be due June of 09.

On May 1st 2008 Ron McCuen, Pat Craig, Dolores Cosgrove and myself along with the engineers from URS met with the PA Fish and Boat Commission, Army Corp. of Engineers, DEP Northeast Region and the Soil Conservation Dept. This meeting was held

so that we can determine what permits we will have to apply for before we can start any work.

We have awarded the road paving contract to Hanson Aggregates. They have addressed the following roads as well as repairing the major potholes which were above the scope of our maintenance force.

Beach parking lot, Dickens Way, Drinkwater Circle, Gasse Glen, Lovelace Road, Whitman, Stephen Way, Van Doran Mew, Towamensing Trail, Scott Lane, Stephenson Way, Lindbergh Circle, Kipling Lane, Jeffers Way and Emerson.

These roads were done with wear coat or overlays. In addition we will be repairing approximately 668 feet of potholes. We had budgeted \$213,000 for roads. We spent \$212,968.

A reminder to all of our property owners: Please make sure that you have current copies of the By-Laws, Rules of Conduct and ACC Regulations. Before you start any

project out side of your house whether new construction, repairs, painting etc. check with our ACC, as to weather you need a permit. If you do not have the proper permits Stop Work Orders will be issued and fines will be levied. We would rather have everyone in compliance then issue the stop work order.

The chipping pile at maintenance will be open every Saturday in May from 8:00am until 2:00pm. The chipping pile will be open on the 3rd Saturday of the month from June through September From 8am to 2pm, property owners only, No contractors or landscapers.

The Beach and Pool will be open weekends starting May 24, 2008. The Beach will open on June 14th 2008 full time. The pool will open the following weekend full time.

Remember if there are no life-guards on duty swimming is prohibited.

The Board of Directors wishes all a Safe and Happy Summer.

BUG OFF

It's summertime, and the living is easy-particularly if you don't have to spend time and energy fending off pesky insects on hiking paths and at backyard barbecues. Aside from being itchy and painful, bug bites and stings send more than 500,000 people to emergency rooms every year with potentially fatal allergic reactions. Pinpoint the weak spots in your arsenal, and brush up on the safest ways to combat the

annual invasion. A tick should be removed only with tweezers. Using alcohol, nail polish, petroleum jelly, or matches could traumatize ticks, and that could cause them to regurgitate gut contents that may include Lyme. Honeybees, wasps and yellow jackets see in the ultraviolet spectrum and are attracted to bright colors and floral patterns. Wear light colors-and avoid sudden movements-to reduce

your chances of being stung. These electric grids (Bug Zapper) are a waste of money (and annoying to boot, with their fried-in-the-electric-chair sound); They actually attract more mosquitoes, upping your odds of bites, while killing beneficial insects such as moths. In 1998, the EPA ruled DEET is safe for repelling mosquitoes and ticks; apply it only every 6 to 8 hours. If you prefer a natural remedy, try a cat-

nip oil product, proven effective in an Iowa State University study. Some mosquitoes and gnats naturally swarm toward the highest part of the body-or to an extension of it, such as a branch. Holding a branch above your head can deter flying bugs.

GAS GRILL SAFETY

As we prepare for the summer months of grilling outside, here are some hints to safety, which will ensure a safe and fun-filled summertime for everyone!

Check the tubes that lead into the burner for any blockage from insects, spiders, or food grease. Use a pipe cleaner or wire to clear blockage and push it through to the main part of the burner.

Check gas hoses for cracking, brittleness, holes, and leaks. Make sure there are no sharp bends in the

hose or tubing. Move gas hoses as far away as possible from hot surfaces and dripping hot grease. If you can't move the hoses, install a heat shield to protect them.

Replace scratched or nicked connectors, which can eventually leak gas. Check for gas leaks, following the manufacturers instructions, if you smell gas or when you reconnect the grill to the LP gas container. If you detect a leak, immediately turn off the gas and don't attempt to light the grill until the

leak is fixed. Never use a grill indoors! Use the grill at least 10 feet away from your house or any building. Do not use a grill in a garage, breezeway, carport, and porch or under a surface that can catch fire.

Do not attempt to repair the tank valve or the appliance yourself. See an LP gas dealer or a qualified appliance repair person. Always follow the manufacturers instructions that accompany the grill. Always keep containers upright. Never store a spare gas container under or

near the grill or indoors. Never store or use flammable liquids, like gasoline, near the grill.

To avoid accidents while transporting LP gas containers, always transport the container in a secure, upright position. Never keep a filled container in a hot car or car trunk. Heat will cause the gas pressure to increase, which may open the relief valve and allow gas to escape.

VOLUNTEERS WANTED

Okay property owners we're looking for a few good men and women to help out this summer. What we have in mind, depending on the response, is some extra time at the pool from 6pm to 8pm. We would like to have a family night, an ID photo badge night once a week and maybe even a teen night. To accomplish these ideas we must have responsible volunteers to serve as lifeguard assistants for two hours. If we can get enough good people you may only have to do it one or two nights during the summer. This may also help with the early June and late August problem of no lifeguards due to college. Only you can make this happen. So stop in the office and fill out a temp lifeguard form and we will be in touch.

BADGE RULES

Badges MUST be worn on person and in plain view at all times, NOT on handbags, etc. while in Towamensing Trails.

Badges MUST be worn while utilizing all of the amenities including but not limited to the Community Center, pool, beach, Game room, Boat Rental area, deck, marina, pavilion, Tennis Courts, and Softball field areas.

Anyone utilizing these areas, whether a Property Owner - Renter - Guest, MUST have appropriate identification. Failure to provide identification and or badges upon request by authorized personnel (Badge Checkers, Lifeguards as well as Security), will result in a fine of \$100.00 + costs and removal from the property, and of the amenities for a period of 1 week for the first offense, \$150.00 + costs and a thirty day (30) suspension for the second offense and a fine of \$200.00 + cost for the third offense as well as revocation of amenity privileges for a period of one (1) year. A fine of \$300.00 + cost will be issued for all subsequent offenses.

Renters are not permitted to use property owner's badges. Any Renter caught using a property owner's badges will result in a fine to the property owner of \$300.00 + cost and badge confiscation.

LAKE AND STREAM RULES

1. You must follow all rules for Pennsylvania Fish & Boat Commission.
 2. Swimming in lake beyond the roped area is prohibited.
 3. NO gasoline motors are permitted in the lake or attached to the boat (other than the Fish & Boat Commission & POA safety boat). Violators will be fined \$50.00 + costs for the first offense and up to \$500.00 + costs for each subsequent violation.
 4. A boat with an electric motor must be State licensed and registered with the T.T.P.O.A. or the owners/property owner will be subject to a Civil Penalty and prosecution by the State Fish and Boat Commission.
 5. The use of the lake when frozen is dangerous and not permitted. The lake is spring fed and may be thin in those areas. A \$25.00 fine + \$10.00 costs for anyone found in violation of this rule.
 6. ATV'S and Snowmobiles are prohibited on the frozen lake. Refer to Recreational Vehicle regulation "Careless Operation".
 7. Use of the boat racks must be registered with T.T.P.O.A. office.
 8. All boats must be registered at the T.T.P.O.A. office annually and have a current sticker.
 9. A Pennsylvania fishing license is required at the age of 16. A \$100.00 fine will be imposed for anyone found in violation of this rule; in addition, violators are subject to a fine and State prosecution by the State Fish & Boat Commission.
 10. See posted fishing regulations on catch limits. A fine of \$25.00 per fish + \$10 cost will be imposed for failing to follow the posted regulations.
 11. Parking and picnicking are prohibited in the boat launch areas. A Civil Penalty will be issued and the vehicle towed at the owners expense.
 12. No Swimming at the Marina.
 13. No one is permitted on the Spillway.
 14. The use of the Island is at your own risk.

POOL RULES

PLEASE MAKE SURE ALL GUESTS AND RENTERS ARE AWARE OF THESE RULES.

Pool Rules: The pool will be open and lifeguards on duty from 11:00 AM – 6:00 PM each day. Unless otherwise posted, please observe the following rules for the pool.

- NO running
- NO food or drinks in the pool area
- NO diving
- NO alcoholic beverages in the pool area
- NO glass or metal objects in pool area
- NO pets
- NO littering
- NO nudity
- NO diapered infants in the pool
- NO children (under the age of 12) without adult supervision
- NO floatation devices allowed beyond the ropes
- NO swimming when lifeguards are off duty
- Pool/Community Center
- Badges must be worn by everyone 2 years of age and older.
- Parents are responsible for their children
- Shoes must be worn in the building

Lake Rules

Lifeguards on duty from 11:00 AM – 6:00 PM each day. Please observe the following rules for the lake.

- NO swimming when lifeguards are off duty
- NO swimming beyond the ropes
- NO alcohol is permitted on the beach
- NO glass or metal objects
- NO pets
- NO littering
- NO nudity
- NO MOTORIZED VEHICLES ON THE BEACH

Beach hours are from 9:00 AM – 10:00 PM No swimming is permitted when lifeguards are off duty.

Badges must be worn by everyone age 2 and above

The beach is closed from 10:00 PM – 9:00 AM everyday. Violators of these rules are subject to fines. Lifeguards and badge checkers have the right to remove unruly or unauthorized persons from both the beach and pool areas. Towamensing Trails is a family oriented community. 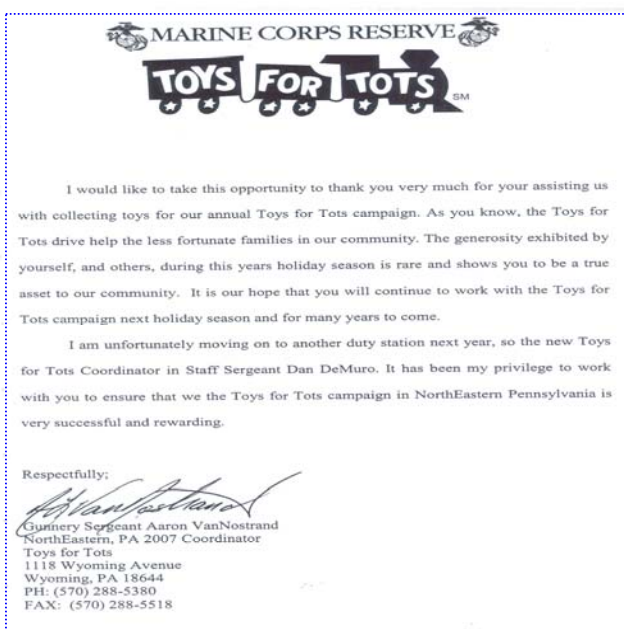
WE SAY GOODBYE TO A GOOD FRIEND AND NEIGHBOR

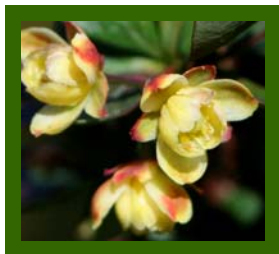

By May 1978 the lake which was built in an area known as Yost Swamp was filled with 800 million gallon of water. However in August it had to be drained, left to dry for a

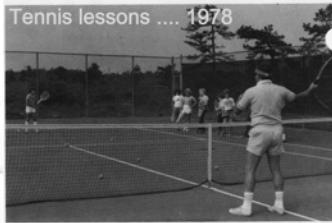


couple of weeks so debris could be removed.



While the water level was down the Trails built a dock behind the clubhouse

The property owners on the lake were encouraged to start building their docks while abiding by ACC rules. Sailboats were purchased for rental. The clubhouse featured live entertainment for the 1st time. This was the 3rd year for the Tennis Courts that were located behind the clubhouse in the current beach parking area. Tennis



lessons were available from the Social Director. The lake was stocked for

the first time. The stable was now offering overnight rides, 2 days, 1 night to 4 days, 3 nights. The pool was open and swimming lessons were offered. The pool had a sliding board and a diving board.

By December of the same year things were taking a downward slide. Kids were no longer welcome at



the Clubhouse as there was too much vandalism. The dam breast was off limits. There was a lot of littering taking place and dumping in the shale pit.....things never seem to change. However on the

positive side, Towamensing Trail (our main road) was now complete from Route 903 to Route 534. Also the rental/resale office was moved from the Teepee to a chalet in the Broadscope Village Complex which was on Towamensing Trail.
